FAMILY INFANT TODDLER PROVIDER RATE INCREASE – appropriates \$8.2 million for provider pay increases recommended in the 2003 cost study on family infant toddler services.

BROADBAND INFRASTRUCTURE FUND – appropriates \$10 million to leverage matching federal dollars for expanding broadband infrastructure to underserved areas in rural New Mexico.

STUDY NATURAL GAS FLARING & VENTING – creates a study of the economic and environmental impact of increased natural gas flaring and venting in New Mexico. EARLY LITERACY ACT – provides new additional support for schools to help children learn language in kindergarten through third grade, and creates a framework for funding early literacy programs.
